FROM OUR DISTRICT PRESIDENT



Dear Sisters in Mission:

I have blessed news to share with you this month! With your generous outpouring of gifts of love to mites in December, we have not only met our 2022-2024 biennium Mission Goal of \$75,000, but we have exceeded it by \$1,719.33! *Praise God from whom all blessings flow* (LSB Hymn #805). Thank you for heeding God's call to share the rich blessings that He has bestowed upon you so that others may hear the Good News and share in the joys of heaven. All thanks, praise, honor, and glory to God!

Our theme for our upcoming April convention is, *Songs in the Night*, based on Job 35:10, "Where is God my Maker, who gives songs in the night." As Paul and Silas sang in prison, we, too, are able to sing during the trials of our lives knowing we are in God's care.

We are so blessed to have such a rich hymnody in our church both in text and music, and I thought I would direct our attention to some of these hymns in the next few months leading up to our convention. This month, let's look at a verse from, "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing."

Oh, to grace how great a debtor
Daily I'm constrained to be;
Let that grace now like a fetter
Bind my wand'ring heart to Thee:
Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it;
Prone to leave the God I love.
Here's my heart, O take and seal it,
Seal it for Thy courts above.

Oh, to grace how great a debtor, Daily I'm constrained to be. God's grace to us sinners is amazing. Did I just reference another hymn? Out of His great love for us and through no merit of our own, He gives us the free gift of salvation earned for us by our Lord's death and resurrection.

Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it; Prone to leave the God I love. What do we often do with this unfathomable grace? We toss it aside to do things our own way. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned – every one – to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all (Isaiah 53:6).

Let that grace now like a fetter Bind my wand'ring heart to Thee. We normally don't think of a fetter in a positive light as we associate it with prisoners. A fetter of iron is placed around the ankles of prisoners to restrain them. A prisoner in fetters and attached to something else isn't going anywhere. No running away. No escaping. We admit in this hymn that while we love God, our sinful nature often leads us away from Him. What a beautiful picture this hymn paints of a fetter, as we pray that God's abundant grace keeps us tightly bound to Him. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:38-39).

Here's my heart, O take and seal it, Seal it for Thy courts above. In ancient times, letters were sealed with clay and then the signer made an imprint with a personal seal so the letter could not be opened. But you may write as you please with regard to the Jews, in the name of the king, and seal it with the king's ring, for an edict written in the name of the king and sealed with the king's ring cannot be revoked (Esther 8:8).

The Lord's seal is placed upon us in our baptism, and we become His children and heirs of eternal life. In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire the possession of it, to the praise of his glory (Ephesians 1:13-14).

Our response to this unmerited and unimaginable gift of grace is to sing our praise to God.

Beloved Ladies of the New England District LWML,

I thank God for you and the wonderful, faithful, and fervent work that you perform giving testimony to your love of our Savior Jesus Christ.

This past year, the NED Missions Department has much to be thankful for and you are right at the top of that list. Through your mite collections, you have supported the church planting efforts of the New England District with two \$5,000 grants: one for the Ethiopian Outreach of Boston and the other for New England District Church Planting in general. Praise God for all His benefits and the manner by which His servants support the Church and her mission and outreach endeavors.

I am pleased to inform you that the Ethiopian Outreach has now formed and chartered as a congregation of the LCMS. Bethel Oromo Lutheran Church is collocated with Mt. Calvary in Acton, MA. Teferi will continue to serve the Oromo immigrant population.

The Lakes Region Lutheran Fellowship in central New Hampshire continues to meet twice each month for a Divine Service. They will begin looking for a new location in 2024 to better serve the area with a Sunday morning service. Your support will help make this possible.

As we celebrate the incarnation of our Lord at Christmas and that He has come among us, we continue to celebrate His presence with His Church and the saints that share this good news in Word and Sacrament.

Lutheran Braille Workers — \$100,000


About This Mission Grant



Church Worker and professional musician Brooke Pernice reading a devotional in Braille alongside her guitar. Having been blind since birth, growing up in the church, and having earned her master's degree in church music, Brooke knows firsthand the challenges in finding rich, theologically sound, and Scripturally-based Christian resources in Braille and Large Print.

Brooke's face reflects her experience of feeling God's love directly in her heart by reading the Scriptures with her fingertips!

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) has the opportunity to reach individuals with visual impairment who live in spiritual darkness with the hope and salvation of Jesus Christ. There are millions of people around the world who are blind or visually impaired. They seek to strengthen their Christian faith while coping with isolation and dealing with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They often find it difficult to access Scripture-based reading materials. This grant will provide LBW the opportunity to produce and add to their library 50 to 100 Scripture-based topical materials in Braille and specialized large print to help meet the spiritual and emotional needs of people who are visually impaired. Because LBW works with every Christian denomination, these materials would be available for outreach and evangelism at no cost to those who are blind or visually impaired regardless of faith or belief.
